## Suggested next priorities

- IVMS byelaw: Similar IFCA byelaws to implement iVMS in all IFCA Districts are expected to become urgent once iVMS technology has been agreed by all fishery regulators
- 3. A vessel size byelaw to limit size or engine power or some or all fishing vessels in the District has been discussed by members on various occasions since 2010. No clear requirement for such a byelaw has been defined and byelaw measurers have not

been proposed. There is no enforcement priority for a general limit on vessel size or engine power within the District.

- 4. A District wide shrimp byelaw has been proposed as a priority, however, with different shrimp measures across the District and in adjoining areas, research would be needed to identify if district wide measures are needed, possible and if so what they would consist of.
- 5. Research is required into most appropriate MCRS for each species in the MCRS byelaw to create stronger scientific underpinning.
