European Marine Site: Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore

Gear type(s): Beach seine/ ring nets

The NWIFCA has assessed beach seine/ ring netting fishing activity in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site.

Activity data was collected by NWIFCA Fishery Officers who report that beach seine/ ring netting in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site is only performed on a recreational basis by up to three fishermen in the north Wirral foreshore area (pers. comm. local IFCO, 2015).

Defra's Revised Approach to the management of Fisheries in European Marine Sites (EMS) is limited to commercial fishing.

As beach seine/ ring netting in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site is only carried out recreationally, the NWIFCA has screened it out of this process.

Activity will continue to be monitored and should the nature of beach seine/ ring netting in the Mersey Narrows and North Wirral Foreshore European Site change and become commercial it will be assessed in accordance with the Revised Approach.
